The International Baccalaureate (IB) Primary Years Programme (PYP) is designed for students aged 3 to 12. It focuses on the development of the whole child as an inquirer, both in the classroom and in the world outside. The PYP framework aims to nurture and develop young students into caring, active participants in a lifelong journey of learning.

The IB PYP and its specialized early learning curriculum provide a comprehensive and balanced educational experience that prepares young learners for future academic success and lifelong learning. By emphasizing inquiry, international-mindedness, and holistic development, the IB curriculum nurtures the growth of well-rounded individuals who are equipped to navigate an ever-changing world.









KEY FEATURES OF PYP LEARNING IN CHOICE

TRANSDISCIPLINARY LEARNING


Students are encouraged to make connections between different subjects and apply their learning in real-world contexts. Through the transdisciplinary units like:

- Who we are.
- Where we are in place and time.
- How we express ourselves.
- How the world works.
- How we organise ourselves.
- Sharing the planet.

The transdisciplinary themes are incorporated into the curriculum through a combination of subjects, including English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Language Acquisition, Art and PSPE (Physical, Social, and Personal Education) additional and STEM, gamification activities like and cooking. The curriculum is designed to include activities that are directly linked to the concepts explored in the unit of inquiry

INQUIRY-BASED APPROACH

- Emphasizes student-driven inquiry, encouraging curiosity and independent learning.
- Teachers guide and support students in formulating their own questions, investigating answers, and reflecting on their findings.



HOLISTIC DEVELOPMENT

- Focuses on developing social, emotional, and cognitive skills.
- Includes physical education and the arts to promote overall well-being and creativity.

INTERNATIONAL MINDEDNESS

- Cultivates an understanding and appreciation of different cultures and perspectives.
- Encourages students to become globally aware and responsible citizens.
- Our curriculum is designed to expose students to a wide range of cultural, social, and intellectual experiences, encouraging them to approach challenges with an open and receptive mindset. Beyond academics, our school actively promotes inclusivity, tolerance, and respect for differences, creating a learning environment where students feel empowered to express their opinions and engage in constructive dialogue.



CONCEPT BASED LEARNING

- Organizes learning around key concepts such as form, function, causation, change, connection, perspective, responsibility, and reflection.
- Helps students to develop deep understanding and transferable skills.

STUDENT-LED CONFERENCES

Student-led conferences (SLC) empower students by giving them the responsibility for their own learning. In these conferences, students explain their learning processes, discuss their projects in detail, and involve their parents in activities they have already mastered in the classroom. This method promotes a deeper comprehension of the educational journey and improves communication among students, parents, and teachers.
